ITEMS NEEDED FOR HOPE'S CLOSET AT PRIOR CROSSING. Hope's Closet is in need of some items for young people moving into their new homes at Prior Crossing, the new housing for homeless St. Paul youth. Prior Crossing was made possible through the generous donations of House of Hope members, in cooperation with Beacon Interfaith Housing and the Wilder Foundation. Hope's Closet needs: 3 large fry pans, 5 can openers, 4 sharp knives, 3 large cooking pots and 12 or more salad-sized plates. (These are the needs as of June 1.)
