



* **Affirmation of Faith** – taken from The Theological Declaration of Barmen

Scripture tells us that, in the as yet unredeemed world in which the Church also exists, the State has by divine appointment the task of providing justice and peace. It fulfills this task by means of the threat and exercise of force, according to the measure of human judgement and human ability. The church acknowledges the benefit of this divine appointment in gratitude and reverence before him. It calls to mind the Kingdom of God, God's commandment and righteousness, and thereby the responsibility both of rulers and of the ruled. It trusts and obeys the power of the Word by which God upholds all things. We reject the false doctrine, as though the State, over and beyond its special commission, should and could become the single and totalitarian order of human life, thus fulfilling the church's vocation as well. [Further] we reject the false doctrine, as though the church, over and beyond its special commission, should and could appropriate the characteristics, the tasks, and the dignity of the State, thus itself becoming an organ of the State.

Note: The Theological Declaration of Barmen was written in January, 1933, by a group of church leaders in Germany to help Christians withstand the challenges of the Nazi Party and of the so-called "German Christians," a popular movement that saw no conflict between Christianity and the ideals of Hitler's National Socialism.




