
THE HOUSE OF HOPE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH



In the Celtic tradition the search to find 'the place of one's resurrection' often led to the wildest and most elemental places. The monastery of Skellig Michael is perhaps one of the most extreme and famous of these. Its barrenness and isolation were suited to the Celtic tradition's stripped-down awareness of God in the elements. Centuries later in the Hebrides, a common practice was to intone one's prayers along the wildness of a beach, allowing 'the voicing of the waves' and 'the praises of the ceaseless sea' to lead one into a sense of the presence of God.




