



Today is the second Sunday in Advent. The word "Advent" comes from the Latin *advenio*, meaning "to come to," and refers to the coming of Christ. During the season of Advent, we celebrate Christ's birth at Christmas, and watch with expectant hope for his coming again. The four weeks of Advent present an opportunity for personal examination, to prepare ourselves for the coming of Christ into our lives.

The Second Advent Banner depicts the angel who came to Mary with a special message: "The child born to you will be...the Son of God." (Luke 1:35). The upraised hand and scroll convey the angel's message and good news of great joy to all people, that a child has been born, a Savior, who is Christ the Lord (Luke 2:11). The flames remind us of the fundamental role played by the Spirit as the means by which Jesus became present as God's Son in our world in the womb of Mary. The season of Advent marks the beginning of the liturgical year in the church.


