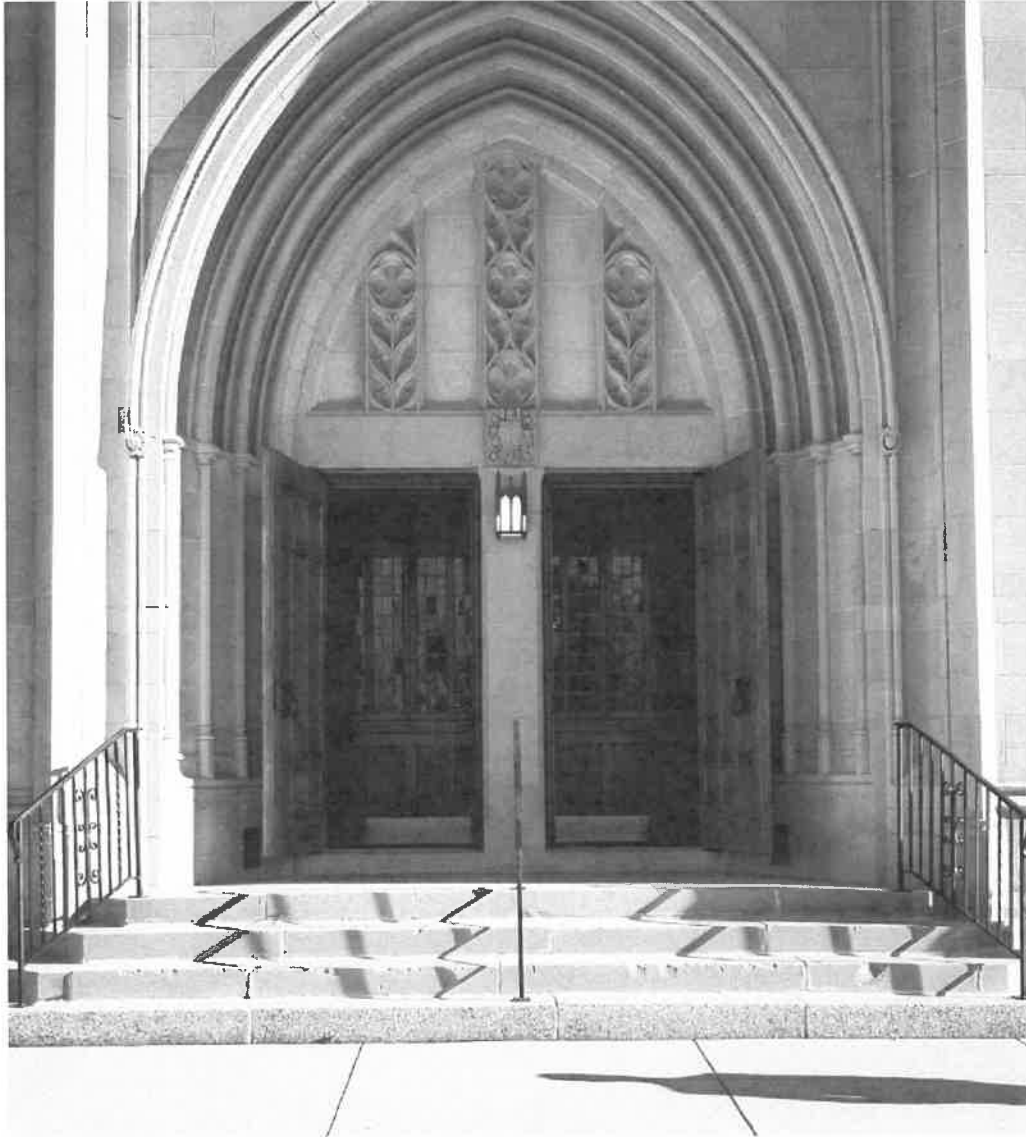

### Elizabeth Chapel Organ Recital Series

Today, April 28 at 4 p.m., the Elizabeth Chapel Organ Recital Series will feature organ music from the 17th and 18th century. Organist Aaron David Miller will be playing a concert with music of Bach, Sweelinck, and Mozart featuring the Jaeckel organ. A reception will follow in the Parlour. The concert is free and open to the public.

Tiffany Ng, Assistant Professor of Carillon at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, will perform today's carillon postlude as a special recital. She holds a doctorate in musicology and new media studies from the University of California, Berkeley, where her dissertation explored how two contemporaneous developments shaped each other: cold war technology and diplomacy, and the revival of organ and carillon building in America and the Netherlands. Ng earned a master's degree in organ from Eastman and an artist diploma from the Royal Carillon School in Belgium. Her concert career has taken her to festivals worldwide, where she has premiered over forty acoustic and electroacoustic works. She also serves on the faculty of the North American Carillon School.
