Since his decision to end the DWS in 2004, he has remained very active as a guest conductor and composer for ensembles across the United States. Dale has had tenures as the Artistic Director of the SPCO Chorale and the Minnesota Beethoven Festival Chorale in Winona. With the House of Hope Motet Choir, he has selected anthems by Stephen Paulus, William Albright, and William Hawley.
