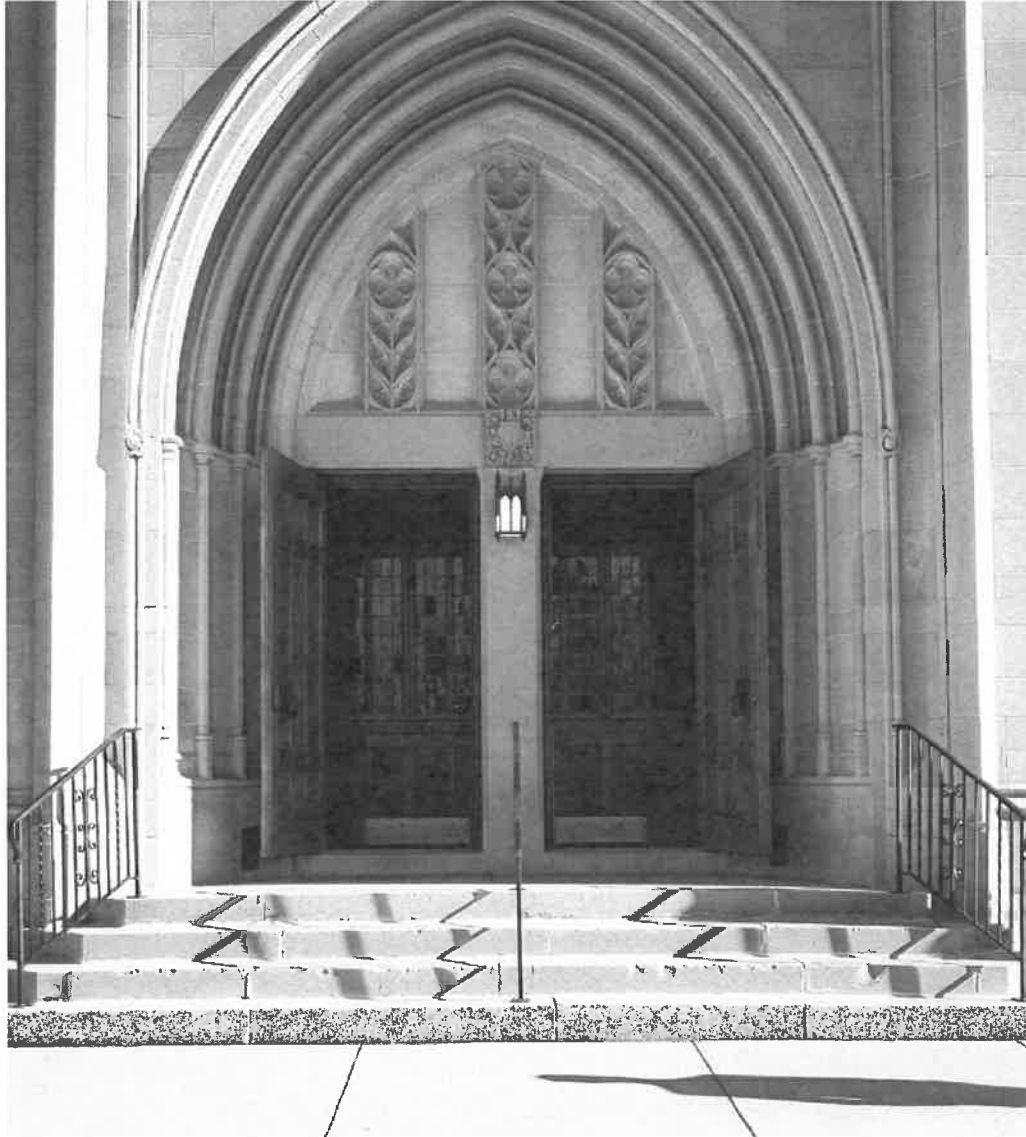


Call to Confession
