# **Body Wellness**

Presenters: Rev. Julia Carlson and Kimberly Owens-Parenteau

The Constitution of the World Health Organization states, "Good health is a state of complete physical, social and mental wellbeing, and not merely the absence of disease or infirmity." It speaks, not just about body, but about the whole human being. The word "health" comes from the Old English word that means "whole." It meant to be hail and healthy, whole and uninjured and has ties to the Germanic, Old Norse, as well as Old English word for holy.
