

Handbells and Harp in Worship.

Today, the Adult Handbell Choir collaborates with harpist Rhonda Grobe (a music educator with the St. Paul Schools) for these Christmastide musical offerings. The Adult Handbell Choir has begun it's 41st year of ringing, and is comprised of volunteer musicians from the congregation and the Twin Cities community. It is the second oldest musical ensemble at the House of Hope. The ensemble is in need of two more ringers for the January to April season. The ensemble rehearses on Wednesday evenings; music reading skills are needed but bell ringing technique is easily learned. Rev. Julia Carlson's Doctor of Ministry

Research Activity. Do you wonder what the 'Nones' and the 'Dones' think about, worry over, or believe? I know I do. A year ago, I interviewed eight folks who do not regularly attend church using six simple questions. I am inviting you to interview one or two of your neighbors who do not attend church using a few open and non-judgmental questions.

There will be a training session today after worship at 11:15 a.m. in Room 1. There will be additional training sessions on Wednesday, January 8, at 1:00 p.m., and again at 5:30 p.m. There will be several opportunities to gather in small groups afterwards to talk about your experience.

Upcoming

Centering Prayer meets on Mondays at the House of Hope at 11:00 a.m. in the Kirk Parlour. Centering is a form of contemplative prayer. It is a practice of focusing on God, or resting in God, and when thoughts distract us from that intent, we practice returning our focus to God through the use of a sacred word. All are invited to attend as your schedule allows. Beginners as well as long time practitioners are welcome.

Sunday Exchange: What do you do with "truths" you no longer believe? What do you still believe ... or not? We'll talk about that next Sunday at 11:15 a.m. in Room 1. Get coffee and come in. If you have children, they can remain in childcare until noon.
