# The House of Hope Choir School

Make a Joyful Noise! The 39th year of HOH Choir School! Registration opens online August 1.

#### **Choir School Ensembles**

Choristers may register for the entire year (Sept–May) or by session (Fall I: September 8–October 20; Fall II: October 27–December 15). Space is limited.

Alleluia Choir: ages 4-6 / PreK-K

St Cecilia Choir: ages 6-9 / grades 1-3

St Nicholas Choir: ages 10-18 / grades 4-12

\*St Andrew Choir: boys, grades 8-12 \*Cantamus Choir: girls, grades 8-12

\*These are additional singing opportunities, and choristers must also sing with the St Nicholas Choir.



Tuition for choristers ages 4-6 is \$150 for the season or \$50 per session. Tuition for choristers grades 1-12 is \$250 for the season or \$75 per session. There is a sibling discount for full season registration. All choristers are welcome regardless of their families ability to pay.

#### **Choir School Voice**

Individual or small group (1-2) voice instruction for children, youth, and adults. Lessons are 25 minutes and are offered online or in-person. Register by session (6 weeks). Space is limited. Tuition is \$75 per session.
