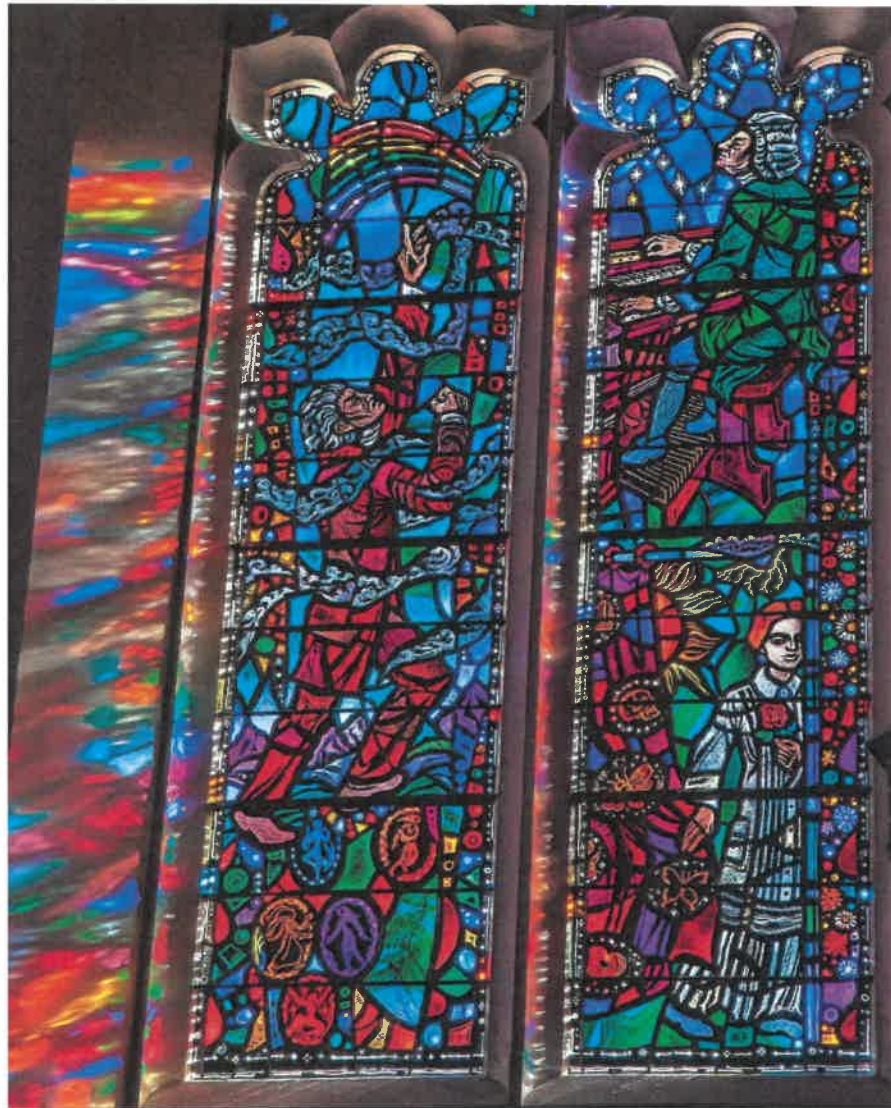

Session Update Regarding Masks for In-Person Worship.

Effective July 4, the Session will no longer require those attending worship to wear masks. 
