An Asemic Advent: New Signposts in a Strange Land

"When the linguistic term *seme* (derived from the Greek *sema*, 'sign') is preceded by the privative a-, the normal meaning of

what follows is neutralized (compare symmetric and asymmetric)," writes Peter Schwenger in his book *Asemic: The Art of Writing.* Join us this Advent for our sermon series as we reflect on an Asemic Advent and four signs pointing us to Bethlehem and the birth of the Christ child.

Pastor | Commentary

For most people, the birth of Jesus was a non-event. There was no awareness that a new way of keeping time had begun. There was no alarm clock that said this is the first day of a new era, *Anno Domini*.

As the Christian church has grown-up through the centuries, Christmas has become a day to anticipate. We wait for Christmas. A new Facebook friend, a McCormick Seminary grad and chaplain, started posting back in July the number of Mondays until Christmas. That's too early for me to contemplate December but, it turns out, he is also a semi-professional Santa Claus for charity events. So, the question becomes, what are we waiting for? Trees, gatherings, giving and receiving gifts ... yes, absolutely. And what else? Are we waiting and listening for God to speak to us of salvation for our time? And what might God be expecting of us?

Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote, "Who will celebrate Christmas correctly? Whoever finally lays down all power, all honor, all reputation, all vanity, all arrogance, all individualism beside the manger." We have much to mourn just now. We have many concerns and cares just now. From climate change to racism to ending this worldwide pandemic, there is much that needs God's salvific touch. These last years have changed us. If we mean to continue to tell one another and the world that the birth of Jesus was and continues to be a lifechanging event, we are invited to consider Bonhoeffer's words.

In some ways participating in God's salvific work is our life's calling, though it's rarely on the calendar; we tend to lose track on a daily basis. So we have this season of waiting to reawaken the anticipation as well as our will for participation in the birth and life of The Christ! Thanks be to God.
