The Rev. Denise Dunbar-Perkins is a retired pastor and Staff Chaplain from Abbott-Northwestern Hospital. A graduate of United Theological Seminary (UTS), she is one of the original founding members of Kwanzaa (now Liberty) Community Church PC(USA) in North Minneapolis, the only African American Presbyterian Church in Minnesota and is also the first African-American female to be ordained into Presbyterian ministry in Minnesota. She currently serves as Chair on the Pastoral Positions Team of COM, and is a past Moderator and Chair of PLT of the Presbytery.

Rev. Denise also serves as Parish Associate at Westminster Presbyterian Church, Minneapolis, along with having been an adjunct professor at UTS, teaching on Black church culture and Womanist Theology. She and her husband, the Rev. Dr. Herbert (Okogyeamon) Perkins live in both in Inver Grove Heights and Montevideo, Minnesota.
