A Note from Julia...

We are here. We are open.

These words keep echoing in my mind. The pandemic has changed our communal existence and interactions. It has changed our

worship and congregational life. For much longer than expected, our building was closed, and we had a sense of absence. That changed over the summer and into the fall but the variants continue to bring risk. Now our congregational life is further changed with Mark and Lynn's departure. We are living through layers and layers of alteration.

Churchill once described Russia as "a riddle wrapped in a mystery inside an enigma." As an echo, I feel like House of Hope has another change wrapped in challenge inside bewilderment. How is it that we find ourselves in transition again? We will no doubt be answering that for a while to come, but one answer might just be, "God only knows."

So, what else does God know? God knows the way through the wilderness (Deut. 2.7). God has searched us and knows us (Psalm 139:1). "God is (and knows) love" (1 John 4:7). God keeps watch and knows about our "going out and our coming in" (Psalm 121:8).

In the middle of Churchill's memorable description is the word mystery just as Divine Mystery is at the center of our faith. "To you has been given the mystery of the kingdom of God ..." (Mark 4:11). In our Christian life change is conversion to the mind of Christ; challenge is an invitation to be daring; and bewilderment is to be perplexed which is invitation to communal discernment. We will walk together in this as both challenge and opportunity.

We are here for one another in the building, online, or on the phone. Together, we are the church, and I look forward to seeing you in church whether for worship, the labyrinth, the new art in the gallery, a stop in the library, or at the jigsaw puzzle exchange.

We are here. We are open.

Revs. Mark and Lynn Barger Elliott have accepted a call to serve as Co-Senior Pastors of the First Presbyte-rian Church of Greenwich, Connecticut.

What will happen next? The Presbytery of the Twin Cities Area and the Pastoral Positions Team will appoint a Moderator of Session and begin the process to identify a Transitional Pastor.

Biblical Stencil Prints by Sadao Watanabe a Collection of Bonnie and Peter Kramer Sadao Watanabe (1913-1996)

Japanese printmaker who, recovering from illness, converted to Christianity

and dedicated his life to expressing his faith through his art. Influenced by Buddhist figure prints, Watanabe placed biblical subjects in a Japanese context and rendered them in the *mingei* (folk art) tradition of stenciling and dyeing, using traditional organic and mineral pigments on handmade papers.
