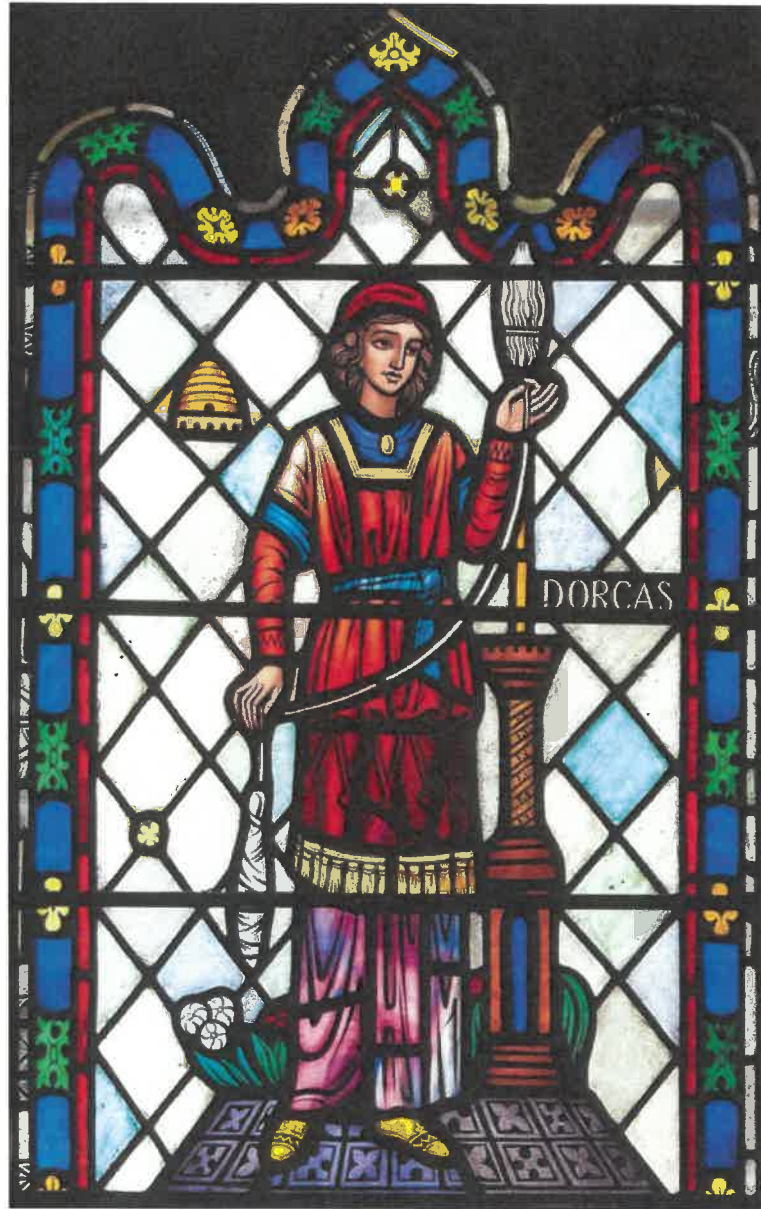



We welcome to the pulpit The Rev. Dr. Molly T. Marshall, President of United Theological Seminary of the Twin Cities.

Serving in theological education for nearly forty years, Rev. Dr. Molly T. Marshall believes she was put on the earth to love students, teach theology, guide spiritual formation, and challenge patriarchal structures that would hinder women from full acceptance in all forms of ministry. She has worked as a youth minister, campus minister, pastor, scholar, and theological educator, seeking to dismantle all forms of oppression.

After teaching for eleven years at The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, KY, she joined the faculty at Central Baptist Theological Seminary in Kansas City, KS, where she served for twenty-five years, the last sixteen as President. Currently she is the President of United Theological Seminary of the Twin Cities. Her great passion in life is spiritual midwifery as she encourages what she sees struggling to be born in the lives of those with whom she serves.

Part of her ministry has been expressed through writing, including blogs, scholarly articles, and opinion pieces. She has published thirteen books, most notably *Joining the Dance: A Theology of the Spirit*. She recently completed a theological commentary on the Thessalonian correspondence that is forthcoming in the BELIEF series. Molly enjoys English choral music, tennis, walking, and cooking her world-renowned theological chili. Her special recipe for “Make Your Bed in Sheol” (the hottest of her repertoire) will revise your eschatology. No longer will you doubt that there is literal hell!

House of Hope Pandemic Response Plan — Spring 2022

Based upon shared and guiding values of caring compassion, wearing a mask at House of Hope will be optional with the following provisions:

- If someone is vaccinated, feels well, and has had no known COVID-19 exposures in the previous 5 days, wearing a mask is optional.
- Anyone who feels more comfortable wearing a mask is encouraged to do so.
- Those who are not vaccinated are asked to continue wearing a mask.
- For our youth and children, we trust parents and our staff to make appropriate decisions for the nursery, Sunday School and Youth Group.
- We trust the Motet Choir, Bell Choir and Choir School leaders to make appropriate decisions for each group.
- If warranted, wearing a mask may become required again based on future COVID-19 conditions and guidelines from the CDC and the City of Saint Paul. This would be communicated to the congregation in a timely manner.


