## **House of Hope Pandemic Response Plan — Spring 2022**

Based upon shared and guiding values of caring compassion, wearing a mask at House of Hope will be optional with the following provisions:

**U.S. Foreign Policy with Andrew Latham**  
**Tuesday, June 14 | Kirk Parlour | 4 p.m.**

Dr. Andrew Latham is a professor of International Relations and Political Theory at Macalester. He teaches courses on regional conflict, grand strategy, great power competition, and Chinese foreign policy. Professor Latham will discuss the Biden administration's foreign policy in light of the deep structural changes that have taken place in the international systems. Specifically, he will explore how the assumptions of liberal internationalism that underpin current US foreign policy are ill-suited to the post-unipolar world in which we live. Professor Latham will discuss the way in which this lack of fit is playing out in the context of the war in Ukraine.
