
Welcome

We welcome to the pulpit the Rev. Canon Peg Chemberlin, who is a coach, speaker, author, and strategist at the intersection of faith and public life. She is the founder and lead consultant of Justice Connections Consultants LLC whose mission is connecting the faith community and the public sector and resourcing the faith community in the work of justice.

She served as CEO of the Minnesota Council of Churches for 22 years. She is a former president of the National Council of Churches of Christ-USA. She is a former supervisor with the Auburn Seminary Justice Ministry Education Program.

Chemberlin was appointed by President Obama to be a member of his first Advisory Council on Faith-based and Neighborhood Partnerships; she sat on the Economic Recovery Task Force and helped to write the report on Refugees and Global Migration. Chemberlin's programming work has included: Refugee Services – placement, resettlement, job training. speaker's bureau, financial literacy, citizenship project; Inter-faith Relationships - Blessed Ramadan Sign project, Taking Heart Iftar Interfaith Experiences, Christian-Jewish, Christian-Muslim Dialogues, Multi-faith Network table, Israel-Palestine Conversation, Interfaith Public Ceremony; Respectful Conversations; Leadership for the Common Good; Minnesota Churches Anti-Racism Initiative; Clergy Sexual Misconduct Prevention and Response; Minnesota Indian Ecumenical Ministry; Joint Religious Legislative Coalition; Minnesota FoodShare. Chemberlin received her M.Div. from United Theological Seminary of the Twin Cities. She is the recipient of an honorary Doctor of Divinity degree from Moravian College and Seminary, the Bridge Builders Award from the Islamic Resource Group, and the Governor's Award for Women of Distinction, among many others. She is ordained in the Moravian Church, has dual standing in the United Church of Christ, and is an honorary Canon in the Episcopal Church in Minnesota.



Based upon shared and guiding values of caring compassion, wearing a mask at House of Hope will be optional with the following provisions:


- If someone is vaccinated, feels well, and has had no known COVID-19 exposures in the previous 5 days, wearing a mask is optional.






