He also served in administrative leadership and teaching roles at Concordia College in Moorhead, Minnesota. Broadly, his work focuses on digital culture, most often the intersections of human experience, systems, and technology. He holds degrees from St. Olaf College (B.A), Columbia Theological Seminary (M.Div.) and a Ph.D. in Rhetoric, Writing, and Culture from North Dakota State University. An ordained Teaching Elder in the PC(USA), Adam lives with his wife and young daughter in Rochester.

# House of Hope Pandemic Response Plan — Spring 2022

Based upon shared and guiding values of caring compassion, wearing a mask at House of Hope will be optional with the following provisions:

- If warranted, wearing a mask may become required again based on future COVID-19 conditions and guidelines from the CDC and the City of Saint Paul. This would be communicated to the congregation in a timely manner.
