**We are delighted you have joined House of Hope for worship.**

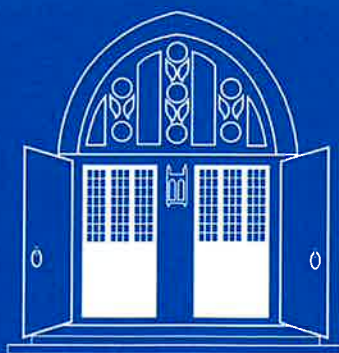



**About Today's Music:** J.S. Bach's Cantata BWV 8, *Liebster Gott, wenn werd ich sterben?* was first performed in September, 1724 in Leipzig. The text of this work is suitable for performance as we remember and acknowledge those who have died in this past year. The work's opening movement poses the question, "Dearest Lord, when will I die?," as a flute colors the movement with a repetitive pattern, reminding us that our time on earth has an ending. The final chorale text asks that our end be good, and that we earn an honest grave among godly people.

This will be the Motet Choir's second performance of the work (first performed in 2015), and will feature soloists Linh Kauffman, Allison Eckberg, Tyler Berg, and Timothy Bruett. Joining the choir and soloists are The House of Hope Chamber Orchestra and organist Aaron David Miller. The Bells of Hope Handbell Choir will play during the reading of the names.

## House of Hope Pandemic Response Plan — Spring 2022

Based upon shared and guiding values of caring compassion, wearing a mask at House of Hope will be optional with the following provisions:

- We trust the Motet Choir, Bell Choir and Choir School leaders to make appropriate decisions for each group.
- If warranted, wearing a mask may become required again based on future COVID-19 conditions and guidelines from the CDC and the City of Saint Paul. This would be communicated to the congregation in a timely manner.
