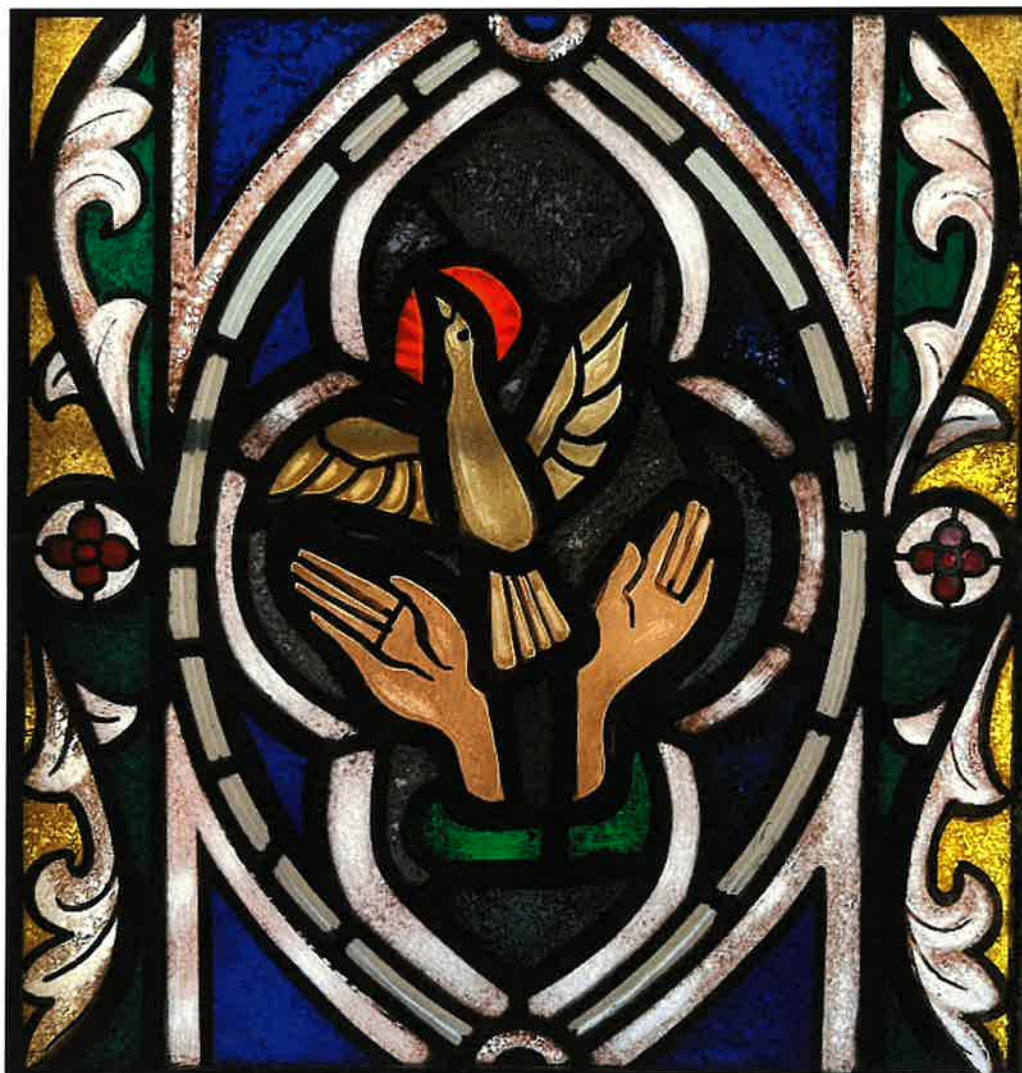



Special Congregational Meeting on June 11, 2023.

The Session has called a Special Congregational Meeting on June 11, 2023, immediately following worship for the purpose of approving a construction loan up to \$5.5 million from the Presbyterian Investment and Loan Program (PILP) to provide needed cash flow for the first phase of the HVAC/Electrical Project. 


