Sunday Morning Family Resources:

- Worship: Children may also choose to engage their faith with their families by staying in the service.
- Worship bags are available in the Narthex with age-appropriate materials to help kids focus as they
 worship alongside their families. You can ask a Deacon to help you find the best bag for you!
- A variety of children's Bibles are located in the church pews.
- A carpeted wiggle space with books and toys is available in the Narthex during the service.
 Feel free to come in and out of the Sanctuary as needed.
- Our **nursery** is open for infants toddlers. A parent/guardian must sign children in and out of the nursery. Bring a photo ID with you.
- **Nursing:** At House of Hope, parents are welcome to nurse their children wherever they feel comfortable.
- **Need help?** Ask a Deacon or Children and Family Ministry staff any time!
