



45 Years of Handbells


Today marks the end of the 45th anniversary year of handbell ringing at the House of Hope. Richard and Peg Blumer gifted 61 Whitechapel handbells to the HOH music program following their visit to the Whitechapel Bell foundry in England. It took 4 years for the foundry to complete the set. The bells arrived at the House of Hope in 1979; a bell choir was formed, a director appointed, and the ensemble first rang for worship services in 1980. In its history, HOH ringers have been heard at the Presbyterian General Assembly, with the St. Paul Civic Orchestra, at the visit of Mikhail Gorbachev to St. Paul, ringing outdoors in the winter for the Minneapolis Holidazzle Parade, at the dedication of the new chapel for St. Olaf Catholic Church, Minneapolis, several weddings for HOH members, numerous upper Midwest regional handbell conventions, and have traveled to Poland and Jamaica. In this milestone year, from its beginning and without interruption to the current year only one original ringer continues in the handbell program: Patricia Freeberg.

There are now three ensembles for varying skill levels and abilities: The Bells of Hope, The Sounds of Hope and Sacred Bells. The ensembles include ringers from the surrounding community and members of House of Hope. They are all volunteers and work to advance the art of handbell ringing for worship, nurture new ringers, and continue their Music in Mission projects for the community. 
