

House of Hope to Welcome Renée Fleming

Save the dates: September 19-21



The House of Hope Sunday Series and Hope Arts Center (HOH Foundation), in collaboration with The Schubert Club, will welcome Renée Fleming for a three-day residency in September.

Ms. Fleming will present a recital “Voice of Nature: the Anthropocene” at the Ordway Concert Hall and be featured on House of Hope’s Sunday Series, speaking about her book *Music and Mind: Harnessing the Arts for Health and Wellness*. A Gala will also be held with Ms. Fleming in celebration of the launch of the Foundation. More details and ticket information coming soon.

Renée Fleming is one of the most acclaimed singers of our time, performing on the stages of the world’s greatest opera houses and concert halls. Honored with five Grammy® awards and the US National Medal of Arts, she has sung for momentous occasions from the Nobel Peace Prize ceremony to the Super Bowl.

In November, she starred in the world premiere staging of *The Hours*, a new opera based on the Pulitzer Prize-winning novel and award-winning film, at the Metropolitan Opera. She won the 2023 Grammy Award for Best Classical Vocal Solo Album for *Voice of Nature: the Anthropocene*.

A leading advocate for research at the intersection of arts and health, Renée launched the first ongoing collaboration between The Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts and the NIH. She is a founding advisor for the Sound Health Network at UCSF.

In her book *Music and Mind: Harnessing the Arts for Health and Wellness*, Ms. Fleming curates a collection of essays from leading scientists, artists, creative arts therapists, educators, and healthcare providers about the powerful impacts of music and the arts on health and the human experience. 



Juneteenth - Freedom Day Carillon Recital

Thursday, June 19 | Noon

Juneteenth, or June Nineteenth, is a commemoration of the day in 1865 when Union soldiers arrived in Galveston, Texas, to announce that all enslaved people in the state were free, two months after the Civil War's end. It's a day to celebrate the emancipation of enslaved people and is now recognized as a federal holiday since 2021.

Juneteenth will be celebrated by a 30-minute carillon recital. The church building will be closed but anyone may stop by and listen to the 30-minute program. Bring a lawn chair or blanket and enjoy the Noyes Memorial Carillon.
