

Our open and affirming, caring active community welcomes people of all ages & backgrounds.

Our regular Sunday Worship time is 10 a.m., followed by refreshments, social hour, and educational opportunities. If you have any questions, our ushers will be glad to help you. **We invite you to join us for refreshments,** today served in the **Kirk Parlour** following the service.

Sunday Morning Family Resources:

- **Worship:** Following the Children's Blessing, children are invited to stay in the service with their guardians, or walk out with their guardians to be led to the Chapel for a worship time for children. Caregivers should come to the chapel immediately after the service to pick up their children.
- **Worship bags** are available in the Narthex with age-appropriate materials to help kids focus as they worship alongside their families. You can ask an usher to help you find the best bag for you!
- A Wiggle Space for children needing a little more scope to move is available in the sanctuary entrance
 way during the service. There are books and toys there for your use. Feel free to come in and out of the
 Sanctuary as needed.
- A variety of children's Bibles are located in the church pews.
- Our **Nursery** is open for infants toddlers. A parent/guardian must sign children in and out of the nursery. Bring a photo ID with you.
- **Nursing:** At House of Hope, parents are welcome to nurse their children wherever they feel comfortable. Feel free to ask an usher if you would feel more comfortable in a more private area.
- **Need help?** Ask an usher or Children and Family Ministry staff any time!

Worship for Children in the Chapel at 10:10 a.m. | Today, August 24.

Jimmy and volunteers will take children to the chapel after the children's blessing. We will engage in some child-friendly rituals connected to the scripture and sermon, as well as have a livestream of the service running as children sit comfortably and engage some quiet activities in a space that allows them to move around and ask questions, while still being in a space of worship.



HOH Parking Lot Informational Meetings TODAY - Sunday, August 24 and September 28 | Assembly Room | 11:15 a.m.

House of Hope leadership has voted to sell the Summit Avenue parking lot, located on the corner of Summit Avenue and Grotto Street. Over the past five years, three task forces were authorized by the Session to review the property and its uses. Each task force was made up of a diverse set of congregational voices and various members from our Session, Trustees, Deacons, and Staff. The Trustees will handle the sale of the property. When an offer is accepted by the Trustees, it will also be approved by the Session, followed by a vote of HOH members at a congregational meeting called by the Session. The Presbytery will review the sale after our congregational vote.
