

Sunday Morning Family Resources:

- **Worship:** Following the Time for Children, children are invited to either stay in the service with their guardians, or walk out with their guardians to the Narthex to be led to the Chapel for special worship for children.
- **Worship bags** are available in the Narthex with age-appropriate materials to help kids focus as they worship alongside their families. You can ask an usher to help you find the best bag for you!
- A **Wiggle Space** for children needing a little more scope to move is available in the sanctuary entrance way during the service. There are books and toys there for your use. Feel free to come in and out of the Sanctuary as needed.
- A variety of **children's Bibles** are located in the church pews.
- Our **Nursery** is open for infants – toddlers. A parent/guardian must sign children in and out of the nursery. Bring a photo ID with you.
- **Nursing:** At House of Hope, parents are welcome to nurse their children wherever they feel comfortable. Feel free to ask an usher if you would feel more comfortable in a more private area.
- **Need help?** Ask an usher or Children and Family Ministry staff any time!







Macalester Sunday: A Shared History House of Hope & Macalester College

We are grateful to Reverend Dr. Edward Duffield Neill for his contributions in founding House of Hope [and Macalester College]. However, his views regarding indigenous people on whose ancestral land our church and city now stand were deeply troubling and in some cases expressed in ways we now find abhorrent. With humility we know that we too are flawed in ways apparent now and others that time will tell. Still, we are called to discern and act to the best of our understanding and to recognize where we have harmed or where we have benefited from others' harmful acts. Given what we have come to understand about Rev. Dr. Neill we are called to recognize the harm done and to work toward wholeness and understanding and righting those harms.

The House of Hope Presbyterian Church is not defined by our founder, yet we recognize our complicity with the past. Therefore, we wish to state:

- We believe all persons are of equal value, dignity, integrity, and respect.
- We believe Black and Brown lives matter to God and to us.
- We believe in the freedom and integrity of the LGBTQIA+ Community and are a Covenant Network Church of the PCUSA.
- We believe we are stewards of the Earth and are an Earth Care Congregation of the PCUSA.
