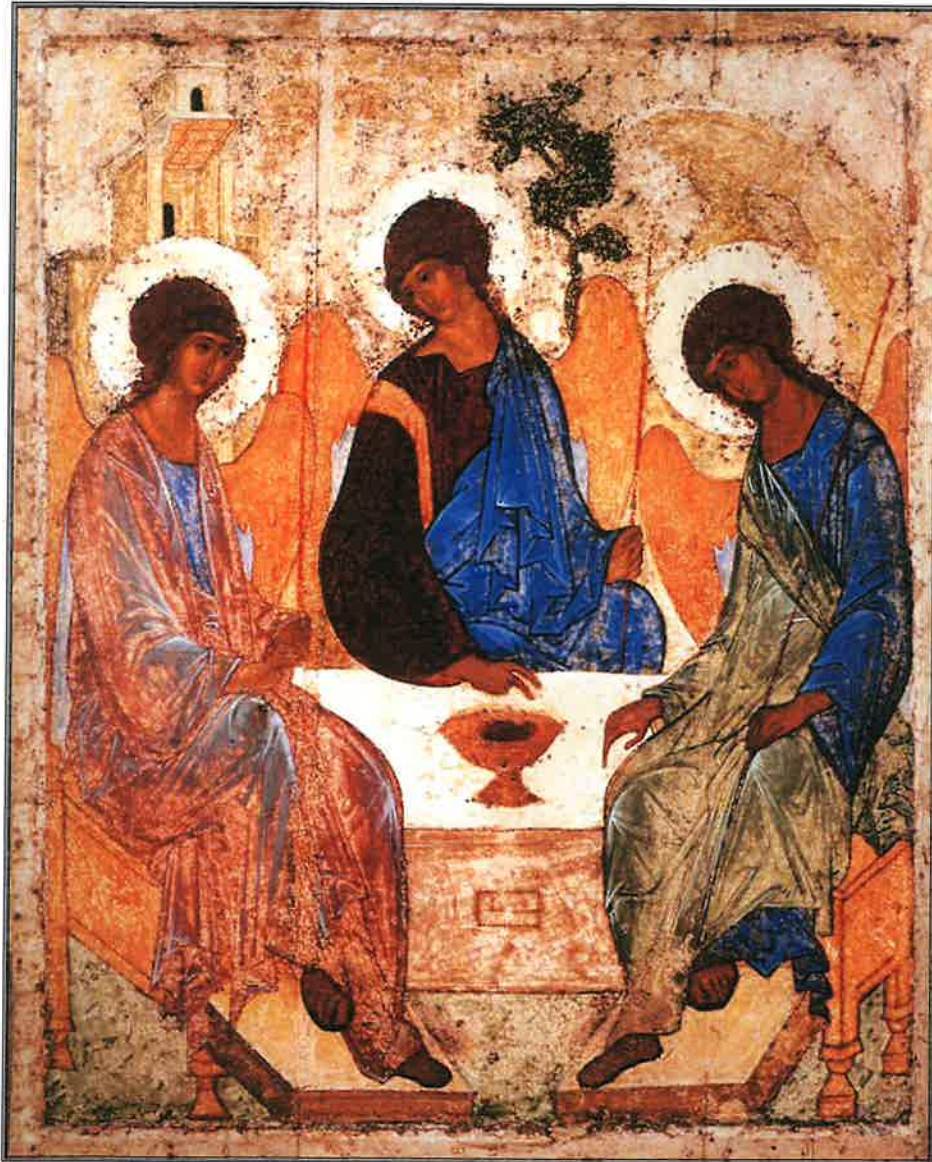

Sunday Morning Family Resources:

- A variety of **children's Bibles** are located in the church pews.
- Our **Nursery** is open for infants – toddlers. A parent/guardian must sign children in and out of the nursery. Bring a photo ID with you.
- **Nursing:** At House of Hope, parents are welcome to nurse their children wherever they feel comfortable. Feel free to ask an usher if you would feel more comfortable in a more private area.

Romine has been serving as the Transitional Associate Pastor for Faith Formation and Lifelong Learning since 2023, and will now be called as the Associate Pastor for Spiritual and Community Care. Upcoming Guest Preacher: On Sunday, June 7, we welcome to the pulpit and Sunday Enrichment Rev. Dr. Jim Mitulski. From Rev. Dr. Scott Jones: "I know of no living pastor who is more experienced in cultivating resilient communities of care and belonging in challenging times than the Rev. Dr. Jim Mitulski." Jim is currently the Pastor of Congregational Church of the Peninsula in Belmont, California. He was ordained in 1983 in the Metropolitan Community Church and has served churches around the country in multiple denominations. In his 15-year pastorate at MCC San Francisco in the eighties and nineties, he provided leadership and pastoral care through the very difficult HIV/AIDS years. That ministry was featured recently on the Peabody Award Winning podcast *When We All Get to Heaven*. In addition to preaching, Rev. Mitulski will also present a Sunday Enrichment titled *Cultivating a Resilient Community in a Time of Crisis*.
